## Touching the lives of animals and people

Volunteers play an essential role at the shelter and in the community to educate others, encourage responsible pet ownership and share the joy of animal companionship.

Many ways to make a difference include the donation of professional services, administrative support, assistance at events, community education and advocacy.

# Many ways to get involved!



**adoptions** Assist staff in the Adoptions Center. Welcome visitors to the shelter and assist customers who wish to adopt an animal or search the shelter for their missing pet.

**admissions** Assist staff in the Admissions Center to welcome animals.

**administrative support** Provide clerical and administrative support such as data entry, answering phones, copying, preparing materials and word processing, as well as assist with lost and found.

**advocacy** Take action on animal welfare issues, legislation and laws. Contact elected officials and organize grassroots support in favor of stronger animal protection laws and pet-friendly initiatives throughout the community.

**animal care** Care for dogs, cats, rabbits and guinea pigs, or assist in pet grooming and kennel cleaning.

**animal behavior** Walk dogs and assist with animal training and socialization. Provide support to adopters with pet tips and advice.

**education** Serve as shelter tour guide, presenter, teen and youth group advisor or program assistant in programs for youth and adults.

**foster care** Provide temporary, short or long-term care for special needs, newborn, injured or recovering animals. Also care for pets of individuals in crisis such as owners who have been hospitalized or military personnel on deployment.

**pet-friendly disaster shelters** Assist by managing a pet-friendly emergency shelter in your neighborhood during a natural disaster.

**pet visitation** Bring your pet to visit those in hospitals, hospice and other Oahu senior and health care facilities.

**special events** Assist with fundraising and community events as well as adoption and education fairs.

**shelter housekeeping** Assist with a wide variety of chores such as laundry, preparing treats for the dogs and maintenance.
