Hawaiian Humane to rename their Community Spay/Neuter Center ahead of World Spay Day

HONOLULU, HI (February 17, 2022) – Hawaiian Humane’s spay/neuter center will be renamed the Ginny Tiu Community Spay/Neuter Center on February 21, 2022 in honor of the esteemed board member’s commitment to O’ahu’s animals in need and her many generous contributions to the organization. This timely dedication comes just ahead of World Spay Day, February 22, a globally recognized annual campaign that aims to educate the public to the benefits of spay/neuter and encourage the community to save animal lives by spaying and neutering companion animals and Free-Roaming cats.

“Our animals depend on us to do the right thing for them. I’m grateful to the Hawaiian Humane Society for doing that. Nothing gives me greater joy and satisfaction than supporting their mission to promote the human-animal bond and the humane treatment of all animals,” said Tiu.

Just one year ago, Hawaiian Humane celebrated its 10,000th spay/neuter surgery performed in the low-cost community facility since opening in 2018.
