Hawaiian Humane announces launch of new mobile adoption and spay/neuter transport van,

enabling the nonprofit organization to bring various services directly to O'ahu communities

HONOLULU, HI (January 11, 2021) – The Hawaiian Humane Society is excited to announce the unveiling of their mobile adoption and spay/neuter transport van at a traditional Hawaiian blessing on Thursday, January 14 at 1 pm. This van will allow the nonprofit to bring pet adoption services directly to communities across the island and transport animals to and from their Community Spay/Neuter Center in Honolulu.

An expanded focus for the animal welfare organization is to improve access to their services in communities where the need is greatest and where transportation and distance can be an obstacle.

"We are incredibly grateful to David Sandler whose generosity enabled the purchase of this vehicle. You'll soon see our mobile adoption team and available pets in communities all across O'ahu. I also want to extend a big mahalo to Matson, Inc. who donated their shipment services and transported the van across the pacific," says Anna Neubauer, President & CEO of Hawaiian Humane Society.

The addition of a mobile adoption and spay/neuter transport vehicle is the first in a series of launches planned for Hawaiian Humane in 2021, all of which expand their capacity for greater community engagement and support.
